Lobbied to shift from a one-semester model to two semesters, where the first is research-oriented and the second is focused on making. Guided seniors on the path to research, concept and design their capstone project. Led students on explorations of passions, process, authorship, social responsibility, client-based work and exhibit design in anticipation of MIAD's senior exhibition.
